Women Development Program

We understand the interwoven challenges women face, from limited education to financial dependence. Our Women's Development Program is a comprehensive approach designed to empower them on all fronts. We provide essential knowledge through educational programs, financial literacy training, and practical vocational skills. This equips them to confidently navigate the world and pursue their goals. Financial independence is a cornerstone of empowerment, so we offer micro-loans through our Bank Linkage programs, allowing women to launch their own businesses and build a secure future.



Focus Areas

1 Empowering Women through Self-Help Groups with Bank Linkage Program:

At WEEDS, we empower women through self-help groups and bank linkage programs, promoting entrepreneurship as a path to economic independence. Our initiatives have successfully helped women develop their skills and start their own businesses, ultimately leading to their economic empowerment.

Through our bank linkage program, we provide loans to women in self-help groups (SHGs). With the support of ICICI Bank, we facilitated loans amounting to ₹9,69,38,684/- for 161 SHGs, and with the support of Indian Bank, we provided loans amounting to ₹8,54,25,000/- for 104 SHGs. These funds are used by the members for their economic development, such as developing small-scale businesses. A total of 3,180 women have benefitted from this initiative.

2 Awareness Training on Prevention of Sexual Harassment of women at workplace Act, 2013 :

To promote awareness and ensure safe workplaces for women, we have partnered with 75 organizations, including IT companies, manufacturing firms, garment companies, and government sectors. Through 214 training sessions, we have reached and educated 5,350 employees on this crucial issue.



3

Integrating Rural Women for Economic Sustainability:

With support from the International Monetary Fund, we established 81 new Women Self-Help Groups (SHGs), providing loans amounting to INR 2,38,32,000/- to empower small entrepreneurs. This initiative has directly benefited 1,053 women and reached an additional 3,100 women through awareness sessions in the Kundrathur block of Kancheepuram District.

WEEDS Tailoring and Aari Embroidery Training Unit: Building Livelihoods and Confidence:

We empower women from self-help groups by equipping them with tailoring and aari embroidery skills, enabling them to generate income and achieve financial independence. FY 2023-24, 67 women have been trained through the WEEDS Tailoring unit, and Aari Embroidery unit.

Empowering rural women through Promotion of Women Rights:

WEEDS is dedicated to advancing women's rights and gender equality in rural areas. In Kundrathur Block - Kancheepuram district of Tamilnadu, we have carried out awareness training programs to empower rural women. Collaborating with local Self-Help Groups (SHGs), we organized empowerment-focused training sessions, impacting over 165 women last year.

Women Entrepreneurship Training:

WEEDS NGO conducted a three Social Entrepreneurship Training for Self-Help Group (SHG) Leaders at WEEDS field office. The programme aimed empowering local leaders and promoting sustainable development through grassroots entrepreneurship. Through this we reached 66 SHG leaders.

Session on Women Empowerment :

A session on Women Empowerment was held at Thirukazhukundram block for the women students of SDNB Vaishnav College during their Rural Camp. The event focused on empowering female students through discussions on gender equality, leadership skills, and personal development. Participants engaged in interactive activities and heard from inspiring speakers, reinforcing the importance of women's active participation in all spheres of life. During the session 35 students participated.

International Women's Day Celebration:

WEEDS celebrated International Women's Day on March 08th, 2024, by honoring the achievements of women with our Women Self-Help Group (SHG) members. This year, around 875 women participated in the event, where we recognized the resilience and determination of women. The celebration featured cultural activities showcasing the rich heritage and diversity of our SHG community. During the event we honored Mrs.Dhanalakshmi Annadurai (Social Activist) for her exemplary work towards upliftment of unorganized women workers.

Children Development Program

WEEDS recognizes that children are the cornerstones of our nation's tomorrow. Our impactful initiatives target underprivileged children, providing them with the essential building blocks for success. We ensure they have access to proper nutrition to fuel their growth, quality education to unlock their potential, and enriching programs to cultivate their skills and passions.



Focus Areas

1

Educational Scholarship Support:

We believe that every child deserves access to education, yet for many from low-income families, this remains an unattainable goal. Our Educational Scholarship Support program seeks out and aids students facing financial barriers to their education. Last year, we provided support to 98 students, enabling them to concentrate on their studies and chase their aspirations. Through our scholarships, we are helping to build a brighter future for these children and their families.

School kits Sponsorship:

Empowering Education: Bringing Joy to Underprivileged Children's Lives: WEEDS is committed to making the dreams of underprivileged children come true by providing essential school kits. We have distributed school kits, slippers, new clothes, and hygiene kits to 130 students from low-income families, including those from Scheduled Tribes. We hope to reach even more children and make their educational journey a little smoother through the help donors.

3

Mentorship for a Brighter Tomorrow:

We provide online mentoring for our scholarship students from 11th grade to college, helping them overcome challenges and excel in their chosen fields. Our mentors are experienced professionals from various corporations who volunteer to guide and inspire our students. Last year, our volunteers mentored 25 students through this program, assisting them in making better career choices.

Build Your Generation – Shaping the Future Leaders Today:

Build Your Generation is WEEDS' initiative to cultivate future leaders by empowering children with essential life skills. We offer online and offline training based on WHO's 10 life skills, guided by volunteers from various companies. Last year, we provided life skills training to 53 scholarship students online and 60 government school students offline, covering topics like personal hygiene, self-awareness, critical thinking, decision-making, empathy, leadership, and teamwork. Our goal is to equip students to confidently navigate life's challenges and achieve personal and professional growth.

Nourishing Minds: Empowering Students Through Nutritional Support:

In Thandalam village government school, we provide weekly nutritious refreshments to 75 10th-grade students from low-income families who are preparing for the board exam. This program ensures that these students have access to healthy, balanced meals, helping them focus better in class and improve their academic performance.

Illuminating Futures - Evening Tuition Centre:

WEEDS' Evening Tuition Center in Penallur village has successfully provided tuition for underprivileged children, prompting us to open a new center in Kundrathur municipality. We support 81 underprivileged students from grades one to ten with personalized evening classes led by experienced teachers. This support boosts students' confidence and motivation, and their progress and enthusiasm highlight the positive impact of our initiative. Our centers are places where young minds thrive and explore their potential.

Rural Students Computer Literacy and Life Skills Training Programme:

Rural Students Computer Literacy and Life Skills Training Programme: Following a successful collaboration between WEEDS and Nielsen - What's On India Media Pvt Ltd, we established a new computer lab at Kovur Pudevattaram Village Government Middle School in Kundrathur Block, Kancheepuram District, Tamil Nadu. This initiative now benefits an additional 182 students, bringing the total to 432 students trained through this project. By bridging the digital divide, we are empowering rural communities with essential tools for success.

Health Development Program

We champion for accessible healthcare by setting up free medical camps in remote rural and suburban communities. Our mission is to bridge the gap for those who need it most, the low-income and underprivileged. These camps provide essential medical consultations and most importantly, raise awareness about critical health issues. We tackle specific needs like bladder cancer through targeted education programs for women, empowering them to take charge of their health. By combining medical care, education, and awareness initiatives, WEEDS strives to build a healthier, more empowered future for all communities.

Bladder Cancer Awareness Creation among Rural Women:


In collaboration with the World Bladder Cancer Patient Coalition, WEEDS organized a Bladder Cancer awareness program in Mangadu and Kundrathur Panchayat. The program empowered 1,100 rural women by educating them about the early signs and symptoms of bladder cancer. The sessions, conducted both online and offline, emphasized the importance of regular check-ups and provided information about available treatments and support services. Our goal is to break the stigma and barriers associated with seeking healthcare in rural areas, empowering women to take control of their health.

Installation of Sanitary Pad Vending Machines in 09 Government Schools :

Through the support of Survey Sparrow, WEEDS provided 12 Sanitary Pad Vending Machine to 9 Government Schools.

Sanitary pad vending machines in girls' government schools are crucial for promoting menstrual hygiene and ensuring that students have easy access to essential sanitary products. These machines help reduce absenteeism caused by menstruation, allowing girls to attend school with confidence and dignity.



Community Development

WEEDS tackles challenges in rural communities through local partnerships. They focus on long-term solutions, like providing educational toys to children at Gerugambakkam Anganwadi School. These play kits foster cognitive and physical development, creating a nurturing environment for growth.



Focus Areas

1

Livelihood skill training for Person with Disabilities:

WEEDS in partnership with The Association of People with Disability (APD, India), conducted livelihood skill training for Persons with Disabilities (PwD) in the Kundrathur Block, Kancheepuram District. This training aims to support individuals with disabilities in securing decent job opportunities in the retail marketing sector. Through this program, 10 individuals were trained and successfully placed in jobs.

2

Chennai Flood Emergency Relief :

In December 2023, WEEDS initiated a flood relief campaign in response to the catastrophic floods in Chennai. Collaborating with local authorities, we prioritized the safety and well-being of our SHG member's family. Our relief efforts reached over 379 families, providing them with grocery supplies for a month. The unwavering support from our volunteers and donors highlighted WEEDS' dedication to community resilience and recovery during this challenging period.

During our relief efforts, we identified five families from the ST community in Mangadu municipality whose homes had been severely damaged. These families, reliant on daily wages for sustenance, found themselves in dire circumstances, unable to afford the necessary repairs. Through the support of our donors we renovated these five homes, ensuring that they had safe and habitable living spaces once again.

Unorganized workers Education Development Program:

The Workers' Education initiative is dedicated to raising awareness and enhancing the knowledge of the workforce, enabling them to actively contribute to socio-economic development. This program specifically targets unorganized working women, providing them with training on health, entrepreneurship, and financial literacy. The training is conducted in partnership with the "National Board for Workers Education and Development."

Furthermore, we play a crucial role in helping unorganized women workers enroll and gain access to various government benefits offered through the "Tamilnadu Unorganized Workers Welfare Board."

Key achievements include:

- Education and Development Training for Unorganized Women Workers: 850
- Unorganized Women Workers Welfare Program: 360 enrolled in the schemes

Corporate Volunteering Activity

Employees from corporates company in collaboration with WEEDS conducts various volunteering activities to empower women and children in the community. Through our programs, we strive to equip participants with the knowledge and tools necessary to address community challenges and foster a more informed and resilient society.



Focus Areas

1

Empowering Women and Children through online training session:

During Nielsen-Gracenote Global Impact Day, employees from Nielsen conducted online sessions for our Women Tailoring Trainees on Leadership Skills. Additionally, they provided valuable lessons for our Government Middle School students, focusing on Effective Communication for 6th and 8th graders, and Self-Awareness & Decision Making for 7th graders. These sessions aimed to enhance the participants' skills and knowledge, fostering their personal and professional growth. This program impacted 22 women and 46 children.

2

Adobe Pro Bono:

Through the NASSCOM MyKartavya Project and Adobe Pro Bono, our volunteers provided invaluable support in several areas. They assisted with pitching documents, such as drafting emails to companies and foundations for project proposals, generating fundraising ideas, managing social media by analyzing content and impressions, conducting website analytics, and developing business plans and strategies. This program significantly contributed to the visibility of our organization.

Session on Cyber Safety for Rural Government School Student:

Our volunteer from Rockwell Automation Ms. Shikha Maheshwari Conducted an awareness session on cybersecurity for rural government school students is crucial in today's digital age. These sessions aim to educate young minds about the importance of online safety, the risks of cyber threats, and best practices for protecting personal information.



Internship & Fieldwork Opportunities for Social Work Students

We launched an Internship/Fieldwork Programme designed to give young students hands-on experience in community-based initiatives, fostering their development into empathetic and engaged citizens. This year, we were pleased to host a diverse group of interns: 2 from Mar Gregorious Arts and Science College, 5 from Madras Christian College, 7 from SA College of Arts and Science, 2 from Christ College, 2 from SDNB Vaishnav College, 3 from Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development and 5 from Shiv Nadar University.

Our interns participated in an extensive training program that covered skills such as proposal writing, fundraising, organizing community events, and executing impactful projects. Through our partnerships with these colleges, we provided valuable guidance, mentorship, and support to help them succeed.

In addition, we facilitated observation visits for 30 students from Mar Gregorious Arts and Science College, allowing them to see our projects and initiatives in action.
